The approximately 335,000 acres of BLM lands eligible for nomination by Pershing County for sale or exchange are lands already identified in the 2015 Winnemucca District Office Resource Management Plan as being potentially suitable for sale or exchange. Annually, Pershing County may select specific parcels, subject to valid and existing rights, and authorized uses for sale or exchange. The proceeds from the sale or exchange would go to: 10% directly to Pershing County, 5% the State of Nevada for education, and 85% would stay in Pershing County for the BLM to use to pay for land actions, drought mitigation, wildlife prevention and for Sage-Grouse habitat, etc.


BLM Wilderness Study Areas will remain as is until action is taken by Congress. This legislation will designate 6 areas as wilderness and release the remaining acres of WSAs to uses other than wilderness. The wilderness portion of this legislation will resolve the wilderness study area issue for the entire county bringing certainty to all users as to what will be wilderness and what won't be wilderness.

Covered Lands (mining) – these land could only be purchased by the entity who held the mining claims located on these BLM lands as of September 3, 2016. Pre-existing land uses (including grazing), third-party valid existing rights, and authorized uses would be preserved.

Disposal Lands - These are lands Pershing County has indicated as priority for sale or exchange. These lands are subject to change based on input during the legislative process.

The 10-acre Unionville Cemetery, located on BLM lands would be transferred to Pershing County.

The legislative process allows for changing those WSA boundaries to find common sense solutions to resolve issues. Current proposal boundaries are subject to change.
